Announcements/Correspondence: Slocum mentioned that she had spoken with Northern Well regarding getting a permit from EGLE to start work on Well #2. A new permit was sent to us from Northern Well and it was signed and sent back in the mail earlier in the day. Pro Tem Joyce McDonald gave an update on the police department contract. She said that it was supposed to start on May 1st but the counties have put a hold on the contract because they are short staffed and cannot dedicate officers to the village. Both counties will continue to patrol within the village limits. Communication regarding a water leak on the corner of Sunset and Munn Street had been received from resident Derek Way. She addressed him and stated that the DPW would start shutting off curb stops one at a time to determine where the leak was coming from. They would begin digging until the leak was located and would have it repaired. McDonald stated that ordinance violations were out of hand and that the council is looking into an Ordinance Enforcement Officer. She also stated that violation letters would be sent out.

Buildings, Grounds & Equipment: Herin reported that a meeting had been held and they have several recommendations regarding work on various buildings. It would be discussed under new business. He stated that some new areas had been identified when quotes were being prepared. A quote was presented to paint the rear of the village hall and to install an awning but the building needs work on the structure including gutters prior to accepting the bid. It was also stated that there should be some work done to the kitchen in Weaver Pavilion Park.

Motion to accept the Department of Public Works Employee Agreement for a CDL License Discussion: The Personnel committee met and had a discussion regarding the changes in state and federal regulations on obtaining a CDL license. The cost for a two week training class would be around \$4,600.00. DPW employee Dustin Homfeld, has his permit for a Class B license, but the village would like him to get a Class A license. An agreement was written by the committee and reviewed by our legal counsel. It outlines that Dustin Homfeld would agree to work for the Village of Hesperia for five years and if he leaves for any reason, he will have to pay the village for the full amount of the cost of his license. The village will not pay for travel expenses or any other incidentals.

Discussion: Slocum explained that a Parks committee was held and meet with Hesperia Beautification to open the doors of communication between them and the Village of Hesperia. Slocum commented that a letter of intent was filed with Oceana County to submit a grant application in the amount of \$50,000 to build a pavilion in Vida Weaver Park. The deadline for the grant is in July. The committee would like to use some funds available from the Fremont Area Foundation for the study and to use American Rescue Plan Act funds for the actual building of the pavilion. Discussion: Halverson inquired about a Chamber Interact committee. It is currently not listed as one but when the new assignments are made after the November election, it can be re-added. The definition of the Dam committee is for the structure only. All other items surrounding dam will be considered Parks.

Public Comment:

Derek Way commented on his ongoing leak in his yard on Munn Street. Stated that the council is hard to get in touch with and he would like to see better communication and transparency with the council. Jim Draper asked about the zoning enforcement officer application process. McDonald explained that the council was at the beginning stages of the process. Anna Dukes inquired about the Wi Fi in the parks and asked about the vandalism in the restrooms. Thomas Meoak voiced his opinion that he did not think it was correct that the village voted to pay the previous DPW Director his unused leave. He also asked about enforcing ordinances and was having problem with children driving ORV's up and down Munn Street and encouraged the council to put ordinance enforcement at the top of their list. Jen Thomas commented on the possible pavilion in Vida Weaver Park and suggested that improving the parking are should be considered as well. Thomas also inquired about the proposals for the DPW buildings and asked if there was a guarantee on the work and asked for an update on the community flagpole project.

Slocum said that under Michigan law, a company has to guarantee it's works for at least one year. Herin responded that a deposit was made in April with expectations that the pole would be installed in early July but does not have an update on when it would be installed. Cammie Hussey stated that she appreciated that a Zoning Enforcement officer was being looked into. She has a few properties by her that are in need of getting the yards cleaned up and grass mowed. Penny Brown asked about having a police presence and that there are people drag racing up and down Michigan Street. Thomas Meoak asked if the council has thought about combining our resources with surrounding municipalities regarding our Operator In Charge of Water and Sewer. Slocum explained that each municipality may have different license levels that are different than ours. Anna Dukes inquired if there was an update on the Marihuana Ordinance. McDonald responded that it has been sent to our legal counsel for a draft to be prepared.

Miscellaneous:

McDonald received a request for a small animal ordinance and turned it over to the Ordinance committee. Herin stated that the front of village hall is in need of repairs to one of the brick pillars on the eastern side. Halverson commented that she working on a Facebook page for the village.
